




URGENT REMINDER IF YOU HAVE SCHOOL AGE CHILDREN

With summer break here and school age children not attending school, please ensure to report the school out days on KidKare. In order to receive credit for school age children's AM Snack and Lunch meals, you need to log in the school out dates on the child's calendar before the current month ends. To do so click on Calendar on the side tool bar> On the top section, select the Child calendar> Then click on the drop down menu to select the name of the child you wish to access >Drag the NO SCHOOL box to the applicable dates in which the child did not attend school. If you make a mistake, simply click on the date and select delete

"Juneteenth, also called Freedom Day, Jubilation Day, and Emancipation Day, commemorates June 19, 1865, when news of the Emancipation Proclamation reached the shores of Galveston, Texas, a year and a half after it was written. Enslaved people were finally to be set free. Since that time, freedom, family, and Black history are jubilantly celebrated on Juneteenth. Juneteenth became a federally recognized holiday in 2021."
